

### **How long is the Veterinary Assistant Course (VAC)?**

### **When are classes?**

Classes are held Monday – Thursday, generally beginning at 5:30 pm and ending by 8:00 pm. Labs are on Fridays, beginning at 8:00 am and ending by 3:30 pm. ### **Where will classes be held?**

The classes will be held in several locations: Humane Alliance Spay/Neuter Training Center, Asheville Humane Society, or A-B Tech (at the Buncombe County Animal Shelter). ### **How much does it cost?**

The course costs \$500, and fees are due by the first day of classes.

### **Am I required to purchase anything for the course?**

### **After the VAC is complete, do you get a certificate or degree?**

After completion of the ten-week course, and eight hours of shadowing at an approved veterinary facility, you will get a certificate from us confirming that you have successfully completed the program.

### **What is the difference between a veterinary technician and a veterinary assistant?**

To become a Registered Veterinary Technician (RVT), you must acquire a two-year degree (at minimum) and sit for a national examination after your schooling is completed. Much like a human nurse, you are licensed by your state's veterinary board, and must pay associated annual fees. *Veterinary Assistants* are often trained on the job. Some have completed some type of Veterinary Assistant program and gained a certification much like the one we offer.

### **Do you help VAC alumni with job placement?**
